

IN THE EVENT OF A BARN FIRE

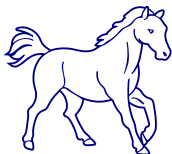
CALL 911 IMMEDIATELY!

If it safe to enter the barn evacuate equine one at a time.

Make sure you use a halter and lead line.

Take the equine to a safe area away from the barn. Utilize round pens, paddocks, or tie them somewhere away from the burning barn. Equine will run back into burning barns out of fear. Blindfold equine only if necessary. They may balk when blindfolded making it more difficult to evacuate.

After a fire have your equine checked by a Veterinarian. Smoke inhalation can cause lung damage or respiratory complications. Due to stress equine may colic after a fire.

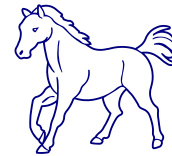
